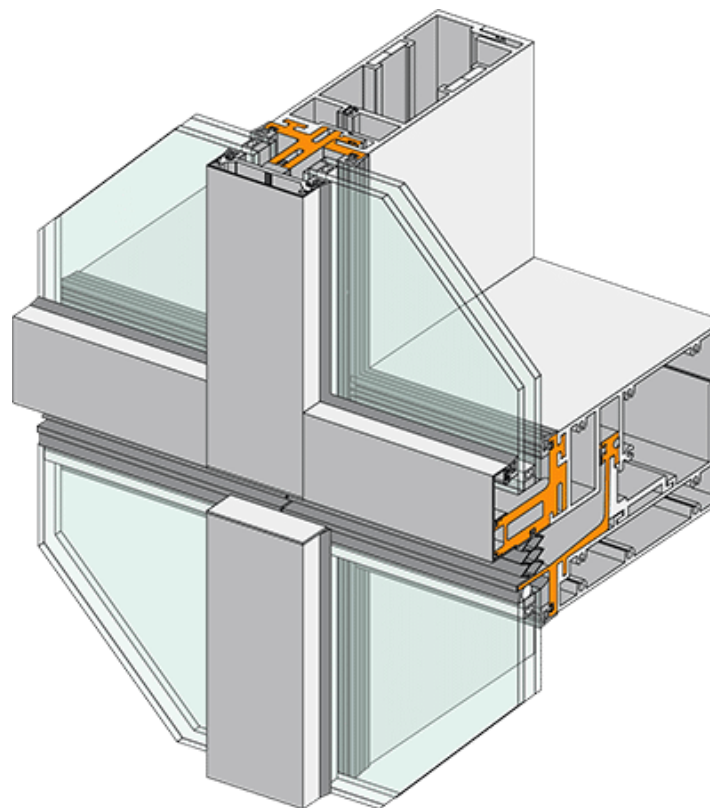

### MANUFACTURING AND PACKAGING (A1-A3)

The environmental impacts considered for the product stage cover the manufacturing of raw materials used in the production as well as packaging materials and other ancillary materials. Also, fuels used by machines, and handling of waste formed in the production processes at the manufacturing facilities are included in this stage. The study also considers the material losses occurring during the manufacturing processes as well as losses during electricity transmission.

All the raw materials are produced outside of our factory. The manufacturing process requires electricity and fuels for the different equipment. In the factory, raw materials including aluminium, steel, glass and silicon, as well as pre-fabricated components, such as rubber gasket and screws are first put through quality check. All materials are then sorted and prepped for fabrication. The extrusions and PVC are sent to the saw

and through machining centers. They are then assembled into the windows and this is where the screws and rubber silicone gaskets are added to the windows. We then set the glass on our frames using an overhead crane. The frames move down the line on roller beds and have silicone shot between the glass and aluminium to create a seal. Once the windows are shot with silicone, we add the caps to the windows to hold the glass in place. Once the silicone is set after 4 hours, we pack them into wood skids that are made from Pine Wood and fasteners. These filled crates are stored indoors and shipped on a trailer to the job site. ### TRANSPORT AND INSTALLATION (A4-A5)

Transportation impacts occurred from final products delivery to construction site (A4) cover fuel direct exhaust emissions, environmental impacts of fuel production, as well as related infrastructure emissions.

Was not considered in this study.

### PRODUCT USE AND MAINTENANCE (B1-B7)

This EPD does not cover the use phase.

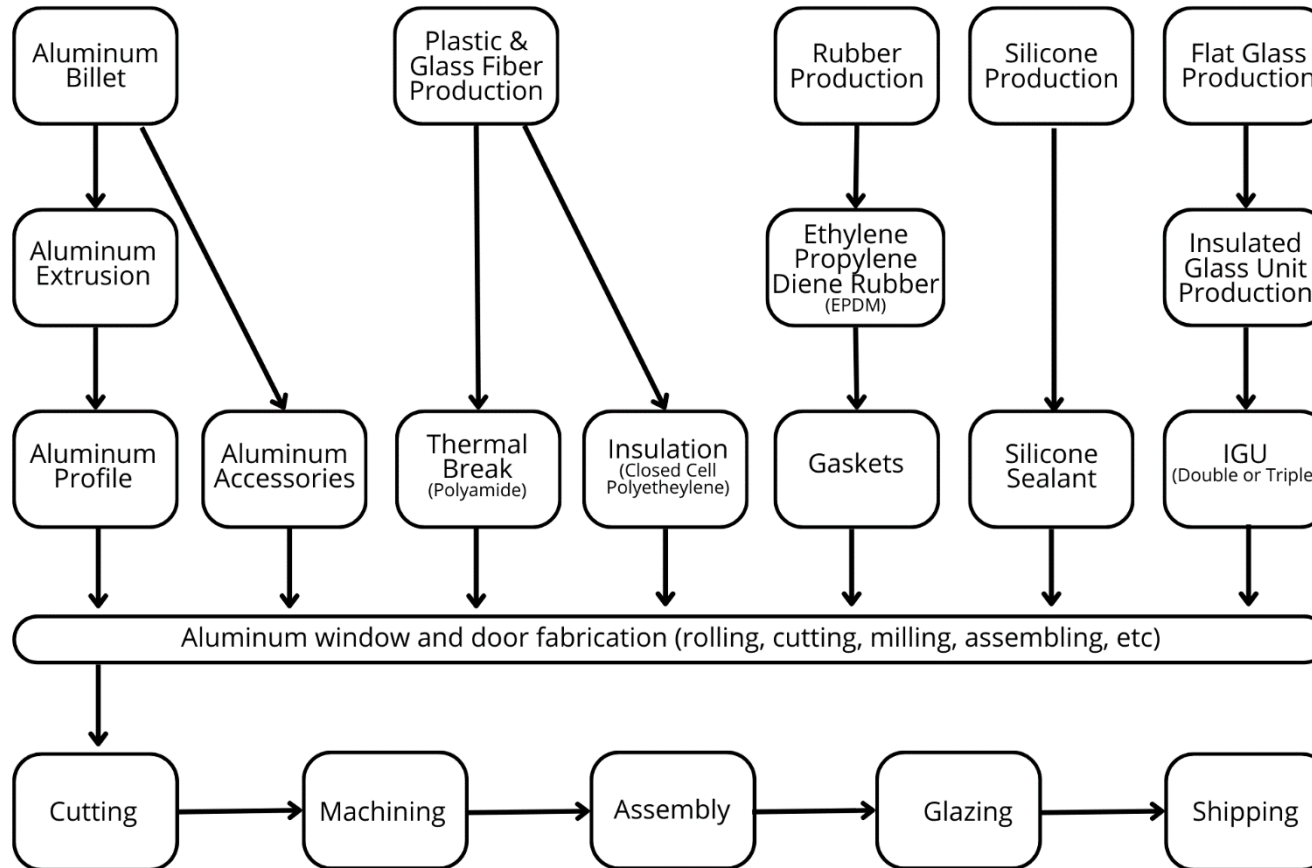
Air, soil, and water impacts during the use phase have not been studied.

### PRODUCT END OF LIFE (C1-C4, D)

The construction of the waste processing facility and the appropriate equipment are not a part of this model. Power tools and heavy machinery are used to remove the curtain wall into its appropriate end of life stream. Due to the material and energy recovery potential of the materials, a part of the end-of-life product is converted into recycled raw materials while electric and heat energy are generated from incineration. The wood pallet

is incinerated, where the energy recovered from incineration displaces electricity and heat production. The aluminium is separated and 100% is recycled. Manufacturing waste and loss including metal scraps are sent 1328 km away to a waste manager for recycling. The rest of the materials and components are landfilled at the end of deconstruction.

## LIFE-CYCLE ASSESSMENT

### CUT-OFF CRITERIA

The study does not exclude any modules or processes which are stated mandatory in the reference standard and the applied PCR. The study does not exclude any hazardous materials or substances. The study includes all major raw material and energy consumption. All inputs and outputs of the unit processes, for which data is available for, are included in the calculation. There is no neglected unit process more than 1% of total mass or energy flows. The module specific total neglected input and output flows also do not exceed 5% of energy usage or mass.

### ALLOCATION, ESTIMATES AND ASSUMPTIONS

Allocation is required if some material, energy, and waste data cannot be measured separately for the product under investigation. All allocations are done as per the reference standards and the applied PCR. In this study, allocation has been done in the following ways:
